The Digital Education Action Plan sets out the vision that "by 2025 all students in Erasmus+ mobility should be able to have their national identity and student status recognised automatically across EU Member States, including access to campus services when arriving abroad."

The AAL Call 2019 is open to developing ICT-based solutions targeting any application area(s) within the AAL domain. The solutions need to be embedded into the strategies of the participating end-user organisations, service providers and business partners. The wishes and aspirations of older people in combination with the demands from the other stakeholders involved —e.g., providers and payers— will have a critical role in shaping useful and attractive AAL solutions with a high market potential.

Eligible applicants:

- Consortium composition of at least 3 independent eligible organizations (legal entities), from at least 3 different AAL Partner States participating in the call for Proposals.
 - Consortia must include at least one eligible for-profit business partner.

“Capacity building for litigating cases relating to democracy, rule of law and fundamental rights violations”- JUST-PPPA-LITI-AG-2018

The objective is to increase the awareness and knowledge of EU law, including the Charter of Fundamental Rights (the Charter), and existing remedies and redress mechanisms to enforce them at national and European level. This call for proposals therefore focuses on funding partnerships and activities benefitting legal professionals and practitioners who may assist or represent individuals wishing to litigate their rights under EU law, including the Charter, at national and European level.

Eligible applicants: Eligible countries: the Member States of the European Union (including their overseas departments); the applicant and the partners must be private organisations or public bodies, duly established in one of the EU Member States, or international organisations; organisations that are profit-oriented may only submit applications in partnership with public bodies or private non-profit organisations; entities affiliated to a beneficiary and linked third parties are not considered as project participants, unless they are included as partners in the proposal.

Horizon Prize 2019 – The European capital of innovation award (ICapital) H2020-European-i-capital-Prize-2019

The Award looks at how applicant cities aim at: Turning into a test-bed for innovative solutions to local societal challenges; including such solutions into their daily policies; allowing citizens to contribute to and use such solutions; cities will have to clearly highlight the achieved and expected social and economic impact of their initiatives and provide relevant supporting elements.

Eligible applicants:

- Cities must be located in one of the EU Member States or in a country associated to Horizon 2020.
- Cities must have a population above 100 000 inhabitants. In countries where there are no such cities, the biggest city is eligible.
- Winners of former European Capital of Innovation Awards contests are not eligible. This does not apply to runner-up and finalist cities
