

## CALL FOR PROPOSALS

### Development Marketplace Award for Innovation in the Prevention and Response of Gender Based Violence 2020

The Sexual Violence Research Initiative (SVRI) and the World Bank Group (WBG) are seeking applications for innovative research and interventions or related activities that will contribute to the prevention and response of gender based violence (GBV) in low and middle-income countries.

Through this award, the SVRI and the WBG are looking to support the following types of projects:

- Piloting, adaptation, testing and/or scale up of new or promising interventions, including formative research that will contribute to the design of GBV prevention interventions or evaluations of effective scale up and adaptation.
- Qualitative studies that explore the effectiveness and process of creating change with innovative GBV prevention interventions or the acceptability, impact, and process of change created by interventions that support and assist survivors of GBV;
- “Integration projects” that test the integration of GBV prevention or prevention and response components or activities in an intervention with a primary objective other than reducing GBV, like those in other development sectors, including large infrastructural projects;
- Self-contained intervention research projects that are either stand alone or fit within a larger project which will build on, or support GBV prevention or response intervention learning, including formative research studies, pilot or feasibility studies.
- Costing studies on promising/effective GBV interventions to assess value for money.
- Adding a new component/arm to an already funded intervention that can provide additional insight into the effectiveness of intervention components.
- Secondary analysis of existing data that will provide insights into addressing VAW more effectively and sustainably.
- Studies to measure ripple/spillover effects of women’s economic empowerment or political participation programming on GBV.
- Research on the role of the private sector in GBV prevention and response, what effective strategies can they deploy within organizations and the communities they work with.

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## Awareness Raising and Information Campaigns on the Risks of Irregular Migration in Selected Third Countries and within Europe (AMIF-AG AMIF Action Grant) - AMIF-2019-AG-CALL-04

The present call for proposals aims at funding projects of information and awareness raising campaigns in the area of migration in the following third countries: Algeria, Morocco, Senegal, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia (with a focus on preventing irregular migration and, in particular, migrant smuggling, as defined in the AMIF work programme for 2019. The campaigns in third countries may be complemented by components in Europe that focus on engaging the target audiences' network connections.

The goal of the present call for proposals is to support actions that pursue the following specific objectives:

- to provide trusted, factual, balanced information on the risks of irregular migration – during the journey (dangers of migrating irregularly) and after arrival (hardship of living in the EU irregularly and return), as well as on relevant legal alternatives of migration and on available economic opportunities in the country or region of origin;
- to empower credible voices in countering migrant smugglers' narratives on irregular migration and the diasporas' narratives on living irregularly in the EU;
- to strengthen multi-stakeholder cooperation between actors such as civil society organisations, researchers, media outlets, local state actors, diaspora and where relevant other stakeholders; and
- to enhance the sustainability of communication activities and results of the campaign.

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## **Support to Victims of Trafficking in Human Beings (AMIF-AG AMIF Action Grant) - AMIF-2019-AG-CALL-05**

Transnational proposals under this topic should aim to contribute to the objectives of the 2017 Communication and ensure that they take into consideration the findings and identified patterns highlighted in the European Commission Second progress report (2018) and accompanying Staff Working Document, and the Study on data collection on trafficking in human beings in the EU, in particular trafficking for sexual exploitation as well as the high-risk groups and high risk sectors concerned.

Concretely, the objectives of this priority are to:

- Facilitate the early identification of third country national victims of trafficking in human beings including in the context of asylum procedures.
- Provide assistance and support to victims of trafficking in human beings, taking into account the specific needs of the victims; these should be appropriate for victims' age, sex and specific consequences of the form of exploitation they have been subjected to.
- Facilitate the integration of third country national victims of trafficking in the host society, taking into account the individual needs of the victims and in view of finding durable solutions and preventing re-trafficking.
- Facilitate the safe and sustainable voluntary return of third country national victims of trafficking, ensuring appropriate risk assessment and with a view to finding durable solutions and preventing their re-trafficking.
- Ensure durable solutions for third country national child victims of trafficking and prevent re-trafficking.

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## Study on the Creation of a CMU Indicators Dashboard – FISMA/2019/045/B
